John "Coach" DeNardo, 87, went to be with the Lord on April 26, 2013. John was born in Pueblo, Colo., and graduated from Central High School. He was preceded in death by his parents, Pauline and Nick DeNardo; brothers, Louis and Sam; and sister, Mamie DeGrado. John is survived by his loving and dedicated wife of 66 years, Mary E. DeNardo; son, Sam (Christianne); daughter, Debbie (Bill) Been; grandchildren, Samantha and Michael; sister, Virginia Plowman; numerous nephews, nieces and special friends. John was a World War II veteran, and after serving with the United States Coast Guard, he attended Pueblo Junior College and Western State College, where he received his bachelor's and master's degrees. He played football and wrestled at Western State. After teaching several years at the junior high level, he transferred to Pueblo County High School's opening year in 1954 as a teacher and coach. He was the first football coach and started the wrestling program. He later transferred to Pueblo South High, where he coached four sports, was a counselor and retired as the activities director. He also taught graduate level courses. He was a people person and through his coaching touched the lives and the hearts of many of his students. He had a genuine interest in all of his students and built strong relationships based on mutual respect that continued throughout his life. He cherished this relationship and often stated that his students and athletes touched his life as much as he touched theirs. His family was the center of his life — his heartbeat; his love was unconditional and absolute. His friends, students and athletes, his pulse — his loyalty and pride never diminishing. Rosary will be at 6:30 p.m. today, May 1, 2013, and funeral Mass will be at 10 a.m. Thursday, May 2, 2013, both at the Shrine of St. Therese. Interment to follow at Roselawn Cemetery. Relatives and friends will be received at 1 p.m. at the Lady of the Meadows Church Hall.
