Her further accolades include being a Counselor for the Philmont Scout Ranch and she was a Marketing Director for Stitch & Sew. Among her busy schedule she was able to spend a lot of time cooking delicious meals for her family and organizing family get togethers. Barb loved being in the kitchen so much that she would bake

specially made cakes for everyone's birthdays and sometimes other occasions, each one more delicious than the last. She would make homemade Italian Sausage and make and bottle her own wine. She loved to write and even became a copywriter for several prominent politicians, but no one more important than her husband, Jim. She was always present for her children, by attending all of their sporting events and being the best mom, anyone could ask for. Barb and Jim lived a wonderful life together, full of love and adventure. They loved taking trips to many places in Europe, they visited Denmark, London, Rome, and Frankfurt. They had the time of their lives on an Alaskan Fishing trip, she genuinely loved life. She loved to travel so much that she even took a girl's trip to New York City with her daughters-in-law, they had a blast and made lots of fun memories. She would spend a lot of time with her grandkids too, she was their babysitter, and they loved the time they were able to spend with her. Most important to Barbara was her faith. She was very involved with St. Joseph Catholic Church and spent several years serving and organizing fundraisers for their events. She loved the Lord and gave that love to her family and friends alike.
