countries, I know in my heart she will be remembered with a warm fondness.

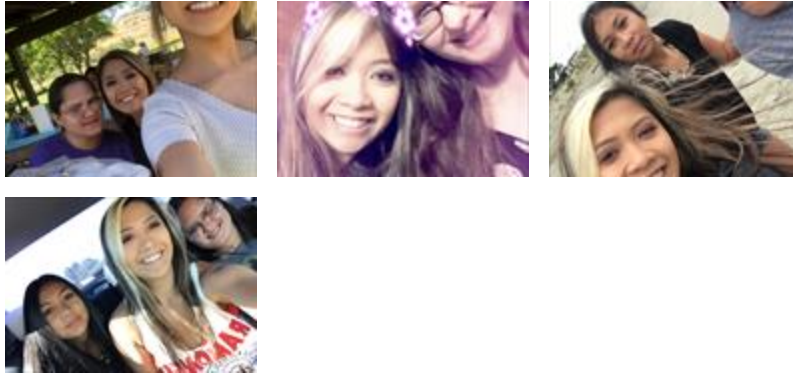
She is survived by her Children, Yurriah Andrew Montgomery (5), Maryann Victorya Montgomery (3)-
