Our beloved Cynthia Taryn Parker passed away on Monday, October 4, at the age of 62. She was born and raised in Pueblo, Colo. She was loved by many and will be deeply missed. Cynthia was a fierce woman – holding fast to her beliefs, defending those she loved and always seeking to better herself. She began her career at St. Mary Corwin where she became the director of transportation. Her skills and passions were multifaceted, and always centered around her family or serving the community. She was a well-known organizer and volunteer with the Pueblo Rangers, held the position of the Referee Assignor for the Sunbelt Tournament, and eventually became the Executive Director of the YWCA. She served on the Pueblo County Community health board and was a founding member of the CRITTER BIDDERS. She was working as a child Advocate in district 60 at the time of her death; working with children and parents to instill and promote the power of education. Cynthia was known for her impeccable decorating, her eclectic style and love of music. She loved organizing the yearly concert trips to attend with lifelong friends, she supported local music talent and attended the Pueblo Symphony often. Her favorite past time was dancing with her soulmate and husband of 32 years on the back patio of the house they built. Cynthia was an exceptional mother and grandmother. There was never a day that went by that she did not brag about all four of her children and share videos of her granddaughter. Her legacy is her family.
