Ben and Dorothy were always my favorite uncle and aunt, mainly because I loved the wonderful children they raised. Thanks for adding so much spice to my otherwise boring farm life. As a child I remember being so excited that I couldn't sleep whenever I heard, "Ben's are coming! Ben's are coming!" All of my favorite childhood memories involve the Schoch kids. That one summer when Ben was in Rochester with stomach problems, you spent quite a few days at our house. Every day was an exciting, fun adventure for me. Also, Ben was Dad's favorite hunting partner. They would go out at dawn and bring home limit after limit of ducks and geese. Dorothy and Mom would be stuck in our basement, cleaning all the birds, and we kids were free to roam the farm, doing all the ridiculous things Judy could think up. Also, we were partners in terrorizing Grandma Schoch, poor lady. No wonder she always called us "Dummers." Remember the time we went to downtown Hosmer and every store was closed. When we asked one of the Hosmer kids, "Isn't anything open?", he replied, "Your moud (mouth) was chust open." That was certainly a classic.

I loved Ben because of his viciously snide Lacher sense of humor whenever he sarcastically analyzed someone he didn't like. And Dorothy would always get that certain look on her face whenever one of her children did or said something particularly outrageous (and that happened quite often). She would try to feign a stern look of reprimand, but her eyes would twinkle, and one could tell that she thought her children were so cute and funny. And I thought so too. In later years, I particularly enjoyed Judy's trips to visit Joanne in Bowdle, and that time we went to the Black Hills to meet you at your Igloo reunion. I'm so grateful that I got to see you and Dorothy several years ago. Thanks to Dennis and Ginny for coming to Pueblo.
