As Liz started her long battle for her health, it became clear that she was a very brave and strong woman. Even in the later days of Liz's illness, her courage never failed her.

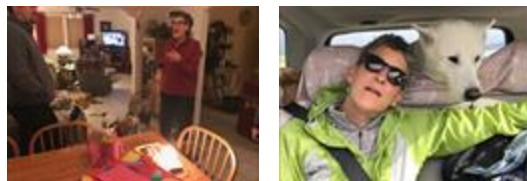
