The head nurse of obstetrics, Dawn, knew that I would be alone when I delivered. She told her staff to call her to come no matter the time, when I went into labor. And, she was there for me. Dr. Zacher was my physician. He asked Dawn why my husband was not at the delivery. The morning I was being discharged, one of the nurses came into my hospital room to tell me Dr. Zacher wanted me to come to the doctors lounge.*

*When I arrive there he told me to sit down. Then he said, why didn't you tell me your husband wouldn't be here?*
