It is with a heavy heart and great love that we share the passing of Harvey "Gene" Eugene Woy, Jr. On June 3, 2026, at the age of 83, after a long battle with Alzheimer's, Gene passed away peacefully in Pueblo, Colorado.

Born on September 3, 1942, in Marion, Ohio, he was the son of Harvey and Martha Woy. On August 10, 1962, Gene married the love of his life, Abbie Gail Rogers. They lived a wonderful and adventurous life together for 60 years, before her passing in 2022. As a young man out of high school he began his career on the Erie Lackawana Railroad in Marion.
