Back in those days, if you were hurt, you ran to your mother. I started running and got to the patio where some of the adults were sitting and Butch stood up and grabbed me and tore open my dress and the firecracker fell out and he stepped on it before it exploded. As a young girl, I just knew it was going to blow up and I would be hurt really bad. He saved that from happening to me and I still have the scar to this day. Over the years, anytime there were family gatherings, I always hoped he would come down for it because you knew if he was there, you were going to have a great time laughing and remembering the good ole' days. He was a veteran of the Vietnam War and will ALWAYS be a hero.
