



Joseph "Joe" Daniel Pisciotta

December 24, 1933 - November 21, 2024

The family of Joseph Daniel Pisciotta, of Avondale, Colorado, is saddened to announce his passing on Thursday, November 21, 2024. Joe passed peacefully in his home surrounded by his family. He was 90 years old. Joe was born on December 24, 1933 to Pete and Ella (Vujcich) Pisciotta who preceded him in death. Joe married his elementary school sweetheart, Marilou (Mauro) Pisciotta, in January of 1954. Together they built a life based on love and faith. Joe was a loving father of three children. The most important thing to Joe was giving his children and grandchildren the opportunities to live a good and productive life. And he did just that.

Joe was an outstanding Cattle Rancher and Farmer. He began farming alongside his Dad, Pete, from the time he was a little boy. His son, Joe, followed in the same footsteps, working the land with his Dad from childhood. Together they built the farm to what it is today, raising superior crops including corn, sorghum, alfalfa, watermelon, pumpkins, red and yellow onions and

wheat. Joe owned and managed a feeder cattle operation where at its peak ran 3,000 head of feeder cattle. He also owned a registered herd of prize winning Hereford cattle.

Joe believed strongly in giving back to the community. When he wasn't working the land he was volunteering in the community. He gave 12 years of service to the Pueblo County School

District 70 School Board, serving as a Board Member and as President. He was a key leader in

establishing funding for several new schools in the District and also made sure Pueblo County

High School had a swimming pool and a newly renovated football stadium.

Joe was a member

of the Pueblo County High School Booster Club. He worked tirelessly organizing Boxing Match

Fund Raisers at the high school so that the Booster Club could buy training equipment for the

athletes. Joe served 14 years on the St. Charles Mesa Water District. Serving 11 ½ years as a

Director and 2 years as President. He was also a long time member of the Bessemer Ditch

Water Board and was a member of St. Therese Catholic Church in Vineland since birth. Later in

life, Joe helped organize a task force that successfully saved and revitalized The Roselawn

Cemetery. Now a place of beauty and tranquility where he will be laid to rest.

Joe is survived by his Wife, Marilou, of 70 years. Father of Lynda Loyd, LouAnn (Tom) Curran

and Joe (Jennifer) Pisciotta. Grandfather to Nicole Loyd, Trevor (Marie) Curran, Brandon Curran,

Michaella Pisciotta and Anthony Pisciotta. Brother to Carmella (Frank) Jordan, and Pat (John)
