Her accomplishments and contributions to the military community were extensive, and for those efforts she was awarded the Vietnam Medal for Civilian Service, was a two-time recipient of the Korean Medal for Civilian Service and four-time recipient of the Commanders Award for Civilian Service, as well as numerous outstanding

and exceptional performance awards. Marilyn was an avid reader, art and antique collector and sports fan. She was also a great advocate of all women's sports in which she played many, especially softball which she pursued as a player and youth coach. At her request cremation has taken place.
