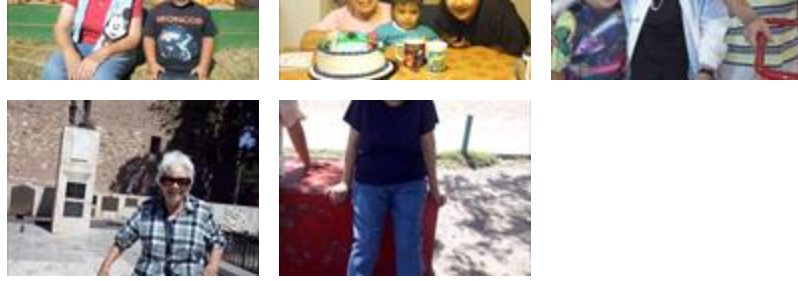
The Lords Prayer Feature

She believed in the power of prayer and prayed and gave thanks to our Lord every morning she woke up and at the end of the day. She was a wonderful cook! She was a very present Grandma, spending a lot of time with them, at their schools, at her home, at their home, at the park, at the Library... She was brave because of love. She came to visit us in 2014, at age 78, making that long trip to be with us. My family and my friend teachers (I took her to visit the school I worked at) remember her with love and happiness. I told my students (from 6th grade) about her, about her faith. They prayed for her “abuela” from United States. And they enjoyed the polvorones (delicious cookies) that Mike made for them in Mary Ann's name. She was happy with every little thing.

It hurts to say good bye, but it gives me peace to know that she rests now. And it gives me hope to know that she will be remembered with a smile, throughout all the love footprints she left. May we follow that loving path. So long, dear, dear Mary Ann, Mom, Grandma, until we meet again in God's love, in which you now rest.
