Chris Robles, 65, beloved husband, father, grandfather, and lifetime Soldier, passed away August 16, 2024 after a long battle with pancreatic cancer.

Born on May 27, 1959, to Manuel (Chuck) and Mary (Serna) Robles, Chris was the fifth of seven children. Chris married Diana Marie Robles (Martinez) on 21 May 1977 and welcomed two children, Alisha and Kristin and raised them while serving his country and moving throughout the world.

Chris was known for doing the “right Thing” for the situation, and people. He decided to do the right thing just as those (Grandfather, Uncles and friends) before him and join the military, from Jul 1980 to July 2012, Chris served in the US Army for 32 years, retiring as Sergeant Major (E9), SGM Robles received numerous accolades, and awards during his career to include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal and Combat Action Badge.
