Susie was well respected by the pathologists and admired by nursing staff in all areas of the hospital for her help and knowledge. Susie will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved her. On August 30th at 10AM, a Mass of Resurrection will take place at The Shrine of St. Therese Parish followed by interment at Roselawn Cemetery with a reception at Fr. Charles Murray Hall at St. Joseph Catholic Church.
